Synopsis of the Armenian Message

In this section of his letter, Paul dwells on the supremacy of Jesus by highlighting His divine attributes. First, He is Creator (vv.15-16). In contrast to some false teachers (back then and today) who said that Jesus was just one among many powers, Paul says that Jesus is the visible image of the invisible God. Second, He is Sustainer (vv.17-18). He is not only Creator, but He also sustains His creation. He holds everything together. Third, He is Redeemer (vv.19-23). Earlier Paul explained how Christ forgave our sins (vv.13, 14). Satan held the world in his death grip of sin. Jesus purchased us back. Like a prisoner released by a kidnapper who received the ransom payment, we are now free.

Friends, Paul's point in verses 21-23 is that Jesus must be known personally and not just through doctrine. But to know Him personally we need to have our doctrine correct. For to live a Chris-rooted life we need to know who He is. The proof that we know Jesus is our transformed lives.
