Synopsis of the Armenian Message

The greatness of Christmas is lost to many people. There are so many little things attached to the Christmas experience that can squeeze out the greatest opportunities. By taking a fresh look at the Christmas story, we can be reminded of important things that will help us keep our lives open to the flow of God's message.

Verses 1-7 describe the world's greatest event. Many wonderful things have happened in the history of our world, but this was the greatest event of them all. Jesus was born in a stable where cattle were fed to show He would be the bread of life. The clothes in which Jesus was rapped signify that the King of the universe became poor so that we might become rich. Could any other event in the world history ever compare to this?

Verses 8-14 describe the world's greatest announcement. The announcement of the birth of the King of the universe was greater than any other announcement in history. Since the birth affected the entire universe, God placed a special star in the sky. Since He would bring great joy, a marvelous choir of angels sang the announcement.

These verses 8-14, also give us the world's greatest message. No other message could affect the world as this one. The announcement of a solution to humankind's greatest problem, the sin problem, was made (v.11). The announcement that there can be peace in our lives while living on this earth was made (v.14). In spite of its greatness, God sent a personal message to everyone who reads it (v.11). This is a message of forgiveness for all of our sins. It is a message that brings freedom from the bondage of sin.

Verses 15-17, describe how this message evoked the greatest response. This message demands a response. The shepherds reacted to the first message in a positive way. They became acquainted with Christ by following the guidance of the message. They shared the message with others after they had received it (v.17). each one of us can react in the same way by having a personal encounter and then by sharing that with others.

Christmas is the greatest day in the history of the world. Do not let the small things of life rob you of the maximum enjoyment of this experience. Let us celebrate the coming of the Christ.
