Synopsis of the Armenian Message

In his third and final letter, the apostle John gives us a glimpse into church life in the latter half of the first century. W. MacDonald writes. "With just a few concise strokes of the pen the apostle sketches in three characters: Gaius the hospitable and spiritual, Demetrius the commendable, and the Diotrephes the self-seeking and unloving." The letter is addressed to Gaius who seems to be doing well spiritually but not so well physically. This is so unlike most professed Christians who in most cases seem to be doing very well physically but not so well spiritually. John says that he is praying for Gaius. We also should be praying for those who are not doing well physically and spiritually. As Gaius is commended for his hospitality, love and generosity toward those who have gone out preaching the Gospel, Diotrephes is reprimanded for his self-seeking, arrogant, inhospitable, and dictatorial leadership. Diotrephes represents the strong self-willed personality types that sometimes gain too much power in a church and begin to assert their will over the whole congregation. The last person mentioned in the letter, "Demetrius is well spoken of by everyone – and even by the truth itself. We also speak well of him." Demetrius is a man of good testimony.

Friends, these three characters from the early church represent the different types of people that all churches at all times have had in their membership. If the apostle John were writing a letter to this church, the ACC, what would he say about you?
