This is how God showed his love among us: He sent his one and only Son into the world that we might live through him. This is love: not that we loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son as an atoning sacrifice for our sins. Dear friends, since God so loved us, we also ought to love one another. No one has ever seen God; but if we love one another, God lives in us and his love is made complete in us.

And so we know and rely on the love God has for us. God is love. Whoever lives in love lives in God, and God in him. In this way, love is made complete among us so that we will have confidence on the day of judgment, because in this world we are like him. There is no fear in love. But perfect love drives out fear, because fear has to do with punishment. The one who fears is not made perfect in love.

We love because he first loved us. If anyone says, "I love God," yet hates his brother, he is a liar. For anyone who does not love his brother, whom he has seen, cannot love God, whom he has not seen. And he has given us this command: Whoever loves God must also love his brother."



Synopsis of Armenian Message

In this section of the letter, Paul deals with the issue of division between Jew and Gentile. The early Christians struggled with this issue. Some Jewish Christians had trouble accepting Gentile converts. Some insisted that they must first become Jews. Paul shows the Ephesians that God's plan was oneness in Christ. In verses 11-12, addressing the Gentiles he says that before Christ they were Christless (separate from Christ), stateless (no citizenship), foreigners to the covenant, hopeless, and godless. Many today are just like that. The barrier between Jew and Gentile was both figurative and literal. An unseen wall of hatred stood between them. But at the temple in Jerusalem stood a real wall, one that kept Gentiles from the temple proper. In verses 13-18, Paul just like in the previous section (2:4) gives us God's solution to this problem, he says, "But now in Christ Jesus you who were far away have been brought near through the blood of Christ" (2:13). It took the blood of Jesus to destroy the dividing wall. It took Christ to bring unity out of division in that day and He is the one who alone can do it in our time. All people - Jew or Gentile - can come to God through Jesus. In His death, He not only brought harmony between man and God, but also between man and his fellowman. Only Christ's blood can save us. Only He can break down every wall that exists today – ethnic, social, political, or whatever it may be. "His purpose was to create in himself one new man out of the two, thus making peace, and in this one body to reconcile both of them to God through the cross, by which he put to death their hostility. He came and preached peace to you who were far away and peace to those who were near" (15-17). In verses 19-22, Paul concludes the section by telling us the result of this unifying work of Christ. In Christ the two become one new structure, a holy sanctuary in which God lives by His Holy Spirit.

Friends, we live in a world very much divided also. Black/white, Arab/Jew, male/female, rich/poor, rightwing/leftwing, conservative/liberal. Christ is the answer to all these divisions. By His blood He can bring peace, healing, and unity..

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
