Synopsis of Armenian Message

In this section, Paul addresses two concepts that are distinct yet related: thinking and behavior or worldview and lifestyle. The way we behave or live is shaped by the way we think. So he urges the Ephesians, and us, to "no longer live as the Gentiles do, in the futility of their thinking" (17). Not having the light of Christ, their thinking is "darkened," and being "separated from God... they have given themselves over to sensuality so as to indulge in every kind of impurity, with a continual lust for more" (18-19). Freedom from this destructive cycle of sinful thinking and behavior comes through "knowledge of the truth that is in Jesus" (20-21). This is not just head knowledge, but a personal relationship that results in "made new in the attitude of your minds; and put on the new self, created to be like God in true righteousness and holiness" (23-24).

Friends, your minds matter because your thinking shapes your life. To experience a change in your life you need to experience a change in your thinking, and to experience a change in your thinking you need the total renewal of the self that only Jesus can bring. This renewal (regeneration) is brought by the Holy Spirit and through the message of the Gospel of Jesus Christ.
