Synopsis of Armenian Message

Philosopher Cicero has said, "A thankful heart is not only the greatest virtue but the parent of all other virtues." Someone else has said, "God has two homes, one in heaven, and one in the content and thankful heart." In the passage above, Paul writes, "Be joyful always, pray continually, give thanks in all circumstances, for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus." (1) "Be joyful always." To be joyful always does not mean that we are never sad, but it means that we see God's hand in every situation. It means that we remain confident in His faithfulness to achieve His promised future salvation. It is easy to be happy and joyful when everything is going well, but what is most significant about the Christian believer is that natural joyfulness that comes from being in Christ. (2) "Pray continually." One of the foundational doctrines of the Christian faith is that humans are neither able to save themselves nor to live their daily Christian life on their own. We need Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of sins and for salvation, and we also, need His Holy Spirit's strength to live a committed life to Him. Because of this, we are aware of our dependence on God and this awareness will keep us in a prayerful spirit. (3) "Give thanks in all circumstances." The worldly persons in their daily lives they encounter situations that make them happy and thankful, and other situations that make them complain and fuss. They accept those things that agree with their purposes, and reject those things that do not. But when a person truly has Christ in their hearts, they begin to understand that God's good purposes are accomplished in all circumstances. This leads to the understanding that the same loving God is at work even in those situations that under normal circumstances we will not accept. It is only when we understand this that we can "give thanks in all circumstances."

Friends, let us learn to be joyful always, to pray continually and to be thankful in all circumstances." Have a wonderful THANKSGIVING!!!
